
SHERIDAN FIRE-RESCUE 2024 FIRE STATISTICS

As of April 1, 2024, Sheridan Fire-Rescue responded to 368 calls. Of those calls, 172 are fire related and 196 EMS related. Following is a list of those calls that are broken down into Major Incident Types:


Sheridan Fire-Rescue's <u>average response time</u> from <u>dispatch to arrival</u> (lights and siren) on EMS calls is 5 minutes and 19 seconds; fire calls is 6 minutes and 2 seconds. The <u>average turnout</u> <u>time</u> from <u>dispatch to enroute</u> (lights and siren) on EMS calls is 1 minute and 3 seconds; fire calls is 1 minute and 32 seconds. Average time on scene is 16 minutes and 50 seconds.




Here are some monthly reports for March:


First graph shows the number of fire code inspections that were done; preplans that was completed; and fire investigations that were conducted.



Second graph shows maintenance hours that were conducted by fire station shift personnel. These hours include weekly apparatus checks; flowing fire hydrants (Spring/Summer); servicing station equipment; and cleaning and servicing the fire station and administration office facilities.



Third graph shows training hours that were completed by fire station shift personnel. Every day station shift personnel sets up and trains for different scenarios.
