Residential Fire Safety Checklist Provided by Sheridan Fire-Rescue Department

	Is the address clearly visible from the street? Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches tall.
	Are all paths, porches, and sidewalks free from hazards and obstructions?
	Are chimneys, stovepipes, and vents maintained, clean, and clear of obstruction?
	Are ashes from fireplaces stored in metal containers with tight fitting lids to cool?
	Are weeds and trees trimmed and clear of the residence?
	Are extension cords rated for outdoor use and plugged into approved exterior receptacles?
	Are BBQ's a safe distance from the residence and combustibles when in use?

	Are extension cords being used as temporary wiring only?
	Are all extension cords and electrical wiring in good condition and protected from physical damage (not extending under doors, through unprotected holes, or under furniture)?
	Do electrical outlets, switches, and junction boxes have appropriate covers?
	Are multi-plug adapters and power taps equipped with overload protection?
	Are breaker panels free from obstruction and breaker switches properly labeled?
	Are GFI receptacles installed adjacent to all sinks?
	Are combustibles kept away from ignition sources such as heating appliances, cooking appliances, and light fixtures?
	Are all vents and ducting clear of debris and excessive lint? Dryer vents shall exhaust to the exterior.
	Do all sleeping rooms have two ways to exit? All doors and windows can be opened by the occupant?

	Is the residence equipped with a Carbon Monoxide (CO) detector? Check the detector for expiration date and operability.						
	Are smoke detectors installed in every bedroom, in a common area outside of bedrooms, and a minimum of one detector on every level of the home?						
	Is there a fully charged portable fire extinguisher accessible?						
	Are cooking appliances kept clean and clear of combustibles?						
	Is the vent fan for the range clean and equipped with a clean grease filter?						
	Do stovepipes, chimneys, and ducts have proper clearance from combustibles?						
	Are gas fired heating appliances (water heater and furnace) clear of storage such as combustible materials and flammable liquids?

	Is there a fully charged portable fire extinguisher accessible?						
	Is storage organized and away from ignition sources?						
	Are flammable liquids stored in approved containers and away from ignition sources?						
	Are all extension cords and electrical wiring in good condition and protected from physical damage?						
	Is the door between the garage and house equipped with a self-closing mechanism?						
	Is the door between the garage and the house wood or steel and fire rated?						
	Is the wall between the garage and house protected with sheetrock on both sides and fire-taped?
